
## BILL FOR

- Long title.* A Law to amend the Appropriation Law, 2020 and for other matters connected therewith
- Commencement.* ( )
- Enactment.* **BE IT ENACTED** by the Akwa Ibom State House of Assembly as follows:
- Context for amendment.* 1. Due to the sharp decline in the price of crude oil at the International Oil Market sequel to the COVID-19 Pandemic which has occasioned a destabilization of the budgetary provisions in the Appropriation Law, 2020, it has become imperative to effect an amendment by way of reduction in the 2020 budgetary provisions to align with current economic realities.
- Issue of additional (N13,000,000,000) and (N182,635,000,000) authorized out of Consolidated Revenue Fund and Capital Development Fund respectively.* 2. The Accountant General of Akwa Ibom State may, when authorized so to do by warrants issued by the Governor of Akwa Ibom State, in addition to the sums provided for in Section 1 of the Appropriation Law, 2020 pay by warrants not exceeding savings in the sum of **Thirteen Billion Naira** from the Consolidated Revenue Fund and **One Hundred and Eighty-Two Billion, Six Hundred and Thirty-Five Million Naira** from the Capital Development Fund.
- Appropriation of Schedules 1 and 2* 3. The amounts mentioned in Section 2 of this Law shall be appropriated to the Heads of Expenditure respectively, as set out in Schedules 1 and 2 of this Law.
- Delegation of power of issuing warrants.* 4. (1) The power of the Governor to issue warrants under Section 2 of this Law is hereby delegated to the State Commissioner for Finance.
- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-section (1) of this Section, the Governor may by himself exercise the power to issue warrants under this Law.
- Short title and commencement* 5. This Law may be cited as the Appropriation (Amendment) Law, 2020 and shall come into force on the 29th day of April, 2020.
